OUR MISSION

Blessings in a Backpack mobilizes communities, individuals, and resources to provide food on the weekends for school-aged children across America who might otherwise go hungry.

OUR VISION

Every school-aged child in America has the nourishment needed to learn and grow. As a leader in the movement to end childhood hunger, Blessings in a Backpack strives to ensure children do not go hungry on the weekends by empowering individuals and communities to take action.

OUR FUTURE

Blessings in a Backpack's goal is to provide **4 million hunger-free weekends** annually for children facing food insecurity by the end of the 2023/24 school year.



CHAMPIONS 'FORE' CHILDREN

In February 2021, the Kate & Justin Rose Foundation donated \$1 million to the Blessings in a Backpack Orlando Chapter. The gift immediately fed 1,000 more children and helped enhance the food bags kids received on Fridays.

"If you don't have food in those tummies, nothing is going to make an impact," said Kate Rose, co-founder of the Foundation and wife of PGA Tour's Justin Rose. "So, we have just been trying to close a little bit of a gap in that area."

This generous donation is in addition to their original gift of \$1.15 million to found the Kate & Justin Rose Foundation Chapter of Blessings in a Backpack, Orlando, in May 2020.

Justin and Kate have supported Blessings in a Backpack for over a decade, helping provide more than 500,000 hunger-free weekends to more than 15,000 children in Central Florida.

"This program is very close to our hearts because Kate and I know Blessings in a Backpack fills a crucial void for children who might otherwise go hungry. I can't expect to play good golf if I'm not properly nourished. How can we expect kids to go a full weekend without enough to eat and then be able to focus on learning the next school week?"

FEEDING OUR FUTURE

Blessings in a Backpack is supported by Cigna Foundation's Healthier Kids For Our Future grant program, a five-year, \$25 million global initiative focused on improving the health and well-being of children. This support included:

- School Investor commitment that fed over 2,200 kids during the 2020-2021 school year
- Funding to support Blessings in a Backpack's national food solution administration
- Virtual national backpack convening conference in June 2021

In addition, Cigna's Midwest office donated boxes of food to kids in Chicago, and Cigna Dental provided oral health kits to over 800 kids in Atlanta, Boston, and Memphis, Tennessee.

WARRIOR FOR KIDS

During the 2020-2021 school year, the Spartan Kids Foundation stepped in and stepped up to help children living with food insecurity all across the United States. **Spartan Kids Foundation gave \$100,000 in matching funds to Blessings in a Backpack that lead to over \$230,000 in donations** to provide children with bags of ready-to-eat food while schools were closed.

Support included:

- Giving Tuesday 2020 match
- World Hunger Day 2021 match
- Nationwide t-shirt design contest sponsor
- Nationwide "Warrior for Kids" volunteer recognition search_sponsor
- "Feed the Kids" fundraising campaign

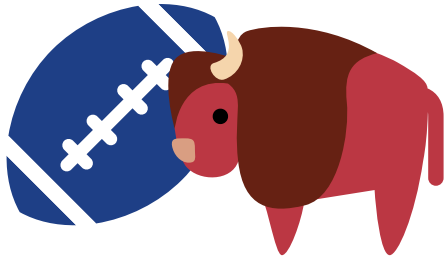
The partnership reached far beyond the obstacle course and showed that everyone has the potential to be a warrior for a hungry child.

GAME-CHANGING SUPPORT

Late in the third quarter of the Baltimore-Buffalo AFC playoff game in January 2021, Baltimore Ravens QB Lamar Jackson was knocked to the ground and forced to leave the game. Although advantageous for Buffalo, Jackson's exit didn't sit well with a pair of Bills fans. Out of respect for their opponent and feeling bad about his injury, William Burke and Dan Konopski—two Bills fans who didn't know each other—took to social media to encourage the team's fan base to donate \$8 (Jackson's uniform number) to Blessings in a Backpack, a charity Jackson is associated with.

A few days later, **18,450 individual donations in Jackson's honor had been made and more than \$550,000 raised.**

The money raised has benefited children living in Louisville, Kentucky (where Jackson played college ball), Baltimore, Western New York, and beyond. Dan and William finally met in person when they distributed food for Blessings in a Backpack together in April.

“This is bigger than sports. The only reason it succeeded is because a lot of somebodies who saw what we posted threw in \$10. By itself, \$10 doesn't accomplish much. But when tens of thousands of people do it so that it becomes a massive movement, each of us ends up having a profound impact on many people's lives.”

HIGHLIGHTS: SUMMER 2020

- 1** Vera Bradley kicked off the back-to-school season with a fashionable cause-marketing campaign. Individuals received an exclusive, free mini-backpack bag charm for any donation of \$10 or more made to Blessings in a Backpack via the Vera Bradley website.
- 2** Whether kids were back in the classroom or learning virtually, we masked up to ensure they had food to eat on the weekends. With your help, Blessings in a Backpack distributed 2.2 million bags of ready-to-eat food during the 2020-2021 school year!
- 3** The Anthem Foundation expanded support as a school investor this school year. Bags of healthy, satisfying food were distributed to 800 children at a Dallas Boys & Girls Club in Texas and elementary schools in Indianapolis, Indiana, Las Vegas, and Nashville, Tennessee.

"Students are excited to see us entering their classrooms on Friday afternoons with the boxes of food from the Blessings program," shared the program coordinator of our Nashville school.
- 4** We asked kids nationwide to enter our first-ever t-shirt design contest. The winning artist was Nate McDermott, 9, from Thousand Oaks, California. His colorful backpack design was printed on t-shirts and sold on the Blessings website. In addition, the Spartan Kids Foundation sponsored the contest, donating a total \$25,000!
- 5** Blessings in a Backpack named two new chapters to the national organization: Chicago and Waukesha County, Wisconsin. Combined, the chapters fed more than 6,700 children during the 2020-2021 school year.
- 6** Minute Rice donated 4,800 ready-to-serve rice cups to Blessings in a Backpack programs in Chicago, Jacksonville, Florida, Santa Maria, California, Frederick, Maryland, New Albany, Indiana, pictured, and many more. Volunteers added the single-serving rice cups to the weekend food bags that kids received on Fridays.



HIGHLIGHTS: FALL 2020

1 Like all things 2020, **National Blessings in a Backpack Week** moved from school buildings to computer screens. In-person events transformed into online fundraisers and awareness campaigns to support our programs across the country.

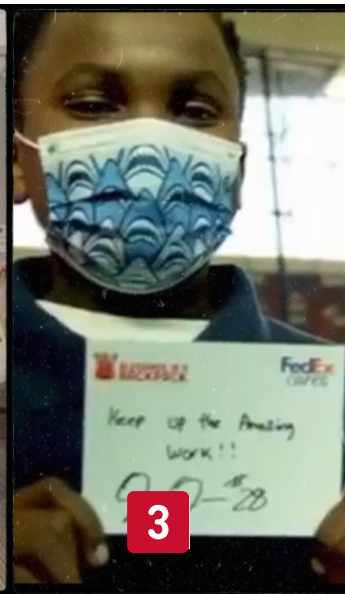
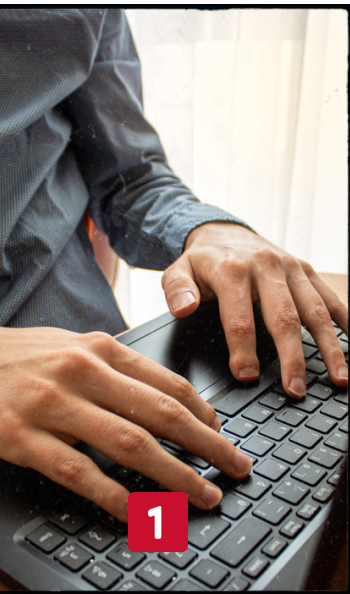
2 Through its 10th annual Eat Well Do Good Campaign, **Nature's Path** employees packed and donated bags of organic food to the Blessings in a Backpack Waukesha County Chapter. Also through the campaign, every dollar raised went towards putting food in the hands of families and individuals who are food insecure.

3 **NFL running back Joshua Jacobs** teamed up with **FedEx** and Blessings in a Backpack to deliver food to elementary school children in the Las Vegas area. The segment aired during the Football Night in America match up between the Las Vegas Raiders and Kansas City Chiefs on NBC.

4 We partnered with the **Spartan Kids Foundation** to recognize those who stepped up to help others during the pandemic—we called them "Warrior for Kids." We featured numerous Warrior stories on social media throughout the fiscal year. For example, we met teacher **Kim Shaughnessy** of Louisville, Kentucky, pictured, on Giving Tuesday.

5 We also recognized donors as "Warrior for Kids" on Giving Tuesday, December 1. We **surpassed our goal of \$100,000, raising more than \$184,000—the single biggest fundraising day in Blessings in a Backpack's history!** In addition, the Spartan Kids Foundation matched \$50,000 of online donations made that day.

6 For the third consecutive year, the Blessings in a Backpack First Coast Chapter partnered with the **TaxSlayer Gator Bowl** to feed kids in Jacksonville! Because of the pandemic, football teams couldn't pack, so Gator Bowl association staff and officers and the Blessings First Coast advisory board pitched in to help. The Gator Bowl donated 1,000 bags of food to three First Coast schools.



HIGHLIGHTS: WINTER 2021

- 1 After 10 years as CEO of Blessings in a Backpack, Brooke Wiseman retired, passing the torch on to her predecessor. After a lengthy nationwide search, **Erin Kerr**, Blessings' chief development officer, was appointed our new CEO. We were truly blessed to have such exceptional talent right in our own backpack.
- 2 Actress **Chrissy Metz** of the show "This Is Us" teamed up with Blessings in a Backpack for **Celebrity Wheel of Fortune**. Chrissy won \$30,000 on the show, which aired on January 14, to help provide 7,500 hunger-free weekends for kids nationwide.
- 3 What started as a tweet and Reddit post by two **Buffalo Bills** fans quickly snowballed into an avalanche of love and support for Blessings in a Backpack and the children we serve. In only a few days, **\$524,000 was donated by NFL fans** to help provide hunger-free weekends for kids nationwide—including Buffalo and Western New York!
- 4 The **Blessings in a Backpack** program in **Frederick, Maryland**, was named a **national chapter** after successfully operating locally for seven years. The chapter fed 3,100 children during the 2020-2021 school year. "Sometimes [children] just need a little bit of help just to get them to that next phase of life," shared Angela Abrishami, managing director, Frederick Blessings.
- 5 The **Kate & Justin Rose Foundation** donated \$1 million to the Blessings in a Backpack Orlando Chapter. The gift immediately fed 1,000 more children and helped enhance the food bags that kids received on Fridays.
- 6 Teachers are heroes among us! They see the realities of childhood hunger daily, and because of that, they're some of Blessings in a Backpack's greatest partners. In the **USA Today** article, "**You Are Strong**," **Vice President Kamala Harris** shared the positive impact Blessings in a Backpack and teachers had on children living in Northeast Florida.



HIGHLIGHTS: SPRING 2021

- 1** The COVID-19 pandemic made it difficult for volunteers to gather together. However, once vaccinations were available in the spring, volunteers were happily reunited again to pack bags of weekend food. In April, we recognized the thousands of volunteers for their dedication, hard work, and heart during **National Volunteer Week**.
- 2** **Fabletics** continued its partnership with Blessings in a Backpack, donating 100% of net proceeds of its children's clothing line. This support helped children who rely on school lunches to safely access food on the weekends and during school closures.
- 3** In May, we raised \$80,300 on **World Hunger Day** to feed kids over the summer in five Blessings in Backpack chapter locations: Chicago, Jacksonville, Florida (First Coast), Louisville, Kentucky, Orlando, Florida, and Southwest Florida. The **Spartan Kids Foundation** matched the first \$20,000 donated on World Hunger Day.

- 4** The **Bobby Nichols Fiddlesticks Charity Foundation** donated \$149,500 to the Blessings in a Backpack Southwest Florida Chapter. "I never dreamed that kids could go to school hungry, and they do even in Southwest Florida, which you'd think, 'My lord.' But now, with Blessings in a Backpack and the help that we have with the other charities, I think we're making an impact," said Bobby Nichols, a former PGA Tour pro and the namesake for the event.
- 5** Before teeing off on the 18th hole, pros at the **Mitsubishi Electric Classic** volunteered with Blessings in a Backpack to pack 500 bags full of ready-to-eat food for kids in Duluth, Georgia.
- 6** Blessings in a Backpack received a \$25,000 grant from **Newman's Own Foundation**, the independent foundation created by the late actor and philanthropist Paul Newman, to feed kids at Burns Latino Academy in Hartford, Connecticut.





OUR IMPACT

Blessings in a Backpack is more than food. Since becoming a 501(c)(3) charitable organization in 2008, we've helped kids all over the country overcome challenges, thrive in the present, and look towards a brighter future.

During the 2020-2021 school year, Blessings in a Backpack provided 2.2 million hunger-free weekends nationwide.

Student survey* results show that children who are fed by Blessings in a Backpack experience the following positive impacts:

- 78% feel cared for by their community
- 71% feel they are helping their family
- 70% say their attendance at school is better
- 69% say it is easier to learn
- 67% say their family is happier
- 62% say they are hungry less often
- 60% have fewer behavioral issues at school

Since 2009, we have provided 23.5 million hunger-free weekends nationwide!

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Blessings in a Backpack had to adapt how it distributed food to children. As a result, the organization's food expense decreased 21% between Fiscal Year 2020 to Fiscal Year 2021. This lower food expense resulted in a lower program percentage compared to prior years.
